I got this story from the paper “Community Connection.” It was written by a very sweet little Christian lady by the name of Rebecca (Becky) Reeps. She writes a little story in every Community Connection edition. I read them every time I get the paper. She always writes such interesting stories about her life during the hard times of “The Depression Era”. As I also grew up during this time; the stories she tells I can relate to. I just thought I would share this one with you.

“Having grown up during the years of the great depression, and living in the small town of Lindale, GA., it seemed there were always trains going by. On those trains there were far too many Hobo's getting off and breaking into people's homes!

I was about four years old at that time. I remember we lived in a three-room house on Hillside St. This little house had a screened in back porch, the best place ever (so mama said) for the water buckets, wash pans and the Ice Box. On this particular day, plus it was in the summertime, Mama had made a chocolate cake (my favorite) for our company coming the next day so naturally she had to keep the cake in the icebox....Big mistake!!!

That just happened to be the night the hobo's decided to break into our home for their food. I slept with my mom and my brother slept with dad. I remember mama waking daddy up, and all four of us were standing at the back door ... scared half to death. I remember holding onto my mama's leg for dear life, while she was trying to keep daddy from going out on the back porch to “talk” to the Hobo!

The next morning...there was an empty cake plate, empty milk bottle...evidence that the hobo's had enjoyed mama's cake, a quart of milk and had slept there. Across the back door of our home was more evidence that they intended to do harm to whoever opened that door! Our “out house” was in the “woodhouse” (another story) and I must say I am so glad we had the “portable potty” (that's not what we called it) in the house that night!

Sometime later that week, my mom and I had gone to the only store in our little town. I am and always have been, a “people watcher” and on this day I notice two men on the railroad tracks not too far from the store. One thing I noticed was, they had the strangest looking luggage...a red checked tablecloth and a broom-stick!

Not long after this, I had gotten a spanking...can you imagine...my two hour “pouting” all done...I decided I would just be a Hobo...no more spankings for this little girl!!

After pondering what I needed to pack and to get my luggage ready...well, I really didn't know...I didn't even remember a vacation! So, I decided on food, clean underwear, my toothbrush and my nickel!

I went in Mom's scrap bag, found a flowered piece of material and a stick, and soon...my luggage was ready for traveling. By then, I had decided I was hungry, so I sat down under the huge shade tree in our backyard and ate every bite of the food I was going to take with me...what to do!!! I started to cry again, so sad!

It was then I decided I had just better stay home! After all...I needed someone to take care of this little kid...Me!!!”

It was then I looked at our old back screen door and saw my sweet mama standing there, watching ever so patiently over her little pouting child, wondering what she was thinking about this time!

Today, I stand in total amazement...just thinking about how much God loves us, always keeping a watchful eye on us, just as my precious mom did me!

God's Eye was and still is today, on the little sparow...Me!!!

This story reminded me of a story my dear mother told me about her childhood: My Mama's father, Luke, was a farmer, Mary, her mother died when she was 13 months old. Like most people living at

HEALTH NUGGET

HEAT OR ICE?

Heat or Ice, which will relieve your aches and pains? Two simple treatments that have been around for generations, heat and ice, are still recommended treatments to handle a number of ailments. Warmth can relieve pain by relaxing muscles, and cold relieves pain by reducing inflammation.

WHEN TO USE HEAT

1. MUSCLE SORENESS AFTER EXERCISE

Technique: Place a moist heat wrap over sore muscles for two hours

How it works: It increases circulation, speeding healing of minor muscle damage.

2. CHRONIC BACK PAIN

Technique: For pain that lingers beyond two or three days, apply a heating lamp or heating pad to the lower back.

How it works: Dilates blood vessels, loosening tight muscles.

Heat increases pain tolerance, blood flow and flexibility.

WHEN TO USE ICE

1. STRAINS

Technique: Immerse affected area in a bucket or tub with ice and water. 20-30 minutes

How it works: Relieves pain and swelling in over-stretched or torn muscles or tendons

2. TENDONITIS

(Inflammation, irritation, and swelling of a tendon)

Technique: Rub an ice cube or water frozen in a paper cup in circles over the sore area. 8-10 minutes

3. SPRAINS

Technique: Apply crushed ice in a plastic bag, an ice pack, or use a bag of frozen vegetables.

How it works: Eases swelling and inflammation in stretched or torn ligaments.

Ice reduces inflammation and numbs the nerves.

ARE YOU AWARE THAT SOME OF THE MAJOR PROPHECIES IN THE BOOK OF REVELATION HAVE ALREADY BEEN FULFILLED LONG BEFORE ANY OF US WERE BORN?

Revelation 6:12, 13 says, "And I beheld when he had opened the sixth seal, and, lo, there was a GREAT EARTHQUAKE; and the SUN BECAME BLACK as sackcloth of hair, and the MOON BECAME AS BLOOD; And the STARS OF HEAVEN FELL unto the earth, even as a fig tree casteth her untimely figs, when she is shaken of a mighty wind."

The fulfillment of these three prophecies found in Revelation 6:12,13: The Great earthquake, Nov 1, 1755; The Dark Day, and the moon becoming as blood, May 19, 1780; and the stars of heaven falling to the earth, Nov 13, 1833 will be addressed during the upcoming issues of the Newsletter. This month we will be talking about the Great Lisbon Earthquake.

The Great Lisbon Earthquake Of 1 November 1755

In the morning of November 1, 1755, a large earthquake struck Lisbon - a great city legendary for its wealth, prosperity and sophistication. It was Sunday and the religious holiday of All Saints. Most of Lisbon's population of 250,000 were praying in six magnificent cathedrals, including the great Basilica de Sao Vincente de Fora. Within minutes, this great thriving city-port of Lisbon, capital of Portugal and of the vast Portuguese empire and seat of learning in Europe, was reduced to rubble by the two major shocks of this great earthquake and the waves of the subsequent catastrophic tsunami. A huge fire completed the destruction of the great city.

The main shock of the great earthquake struck Portugal at 9:40 in the morning of November 1, 1775. At that time, there were no instruments to record or measure earthquakes but experts have estimated that the magnitude of the Great Lisbon Earthquake must have been 8.6 or even greater. The observations of the effects and the ground motions suggest a moment magnitude closer to 9.0.

There were three distinct quake shocks over a ten minute period. The first shock was followed

by an even more powerful second shock which sent buildings toppling down. According to reports, the tremors and the ground motions from this shock lasted for three-and-one-half minutes. Gigantic fissures of up to 15 feet wide tore through the center of Lisbon. A third shock was less powerful.

Two major aftershocks occurred on December 11 and December 23, 1755 and caused added agony and despair to survivors. Strong aftershocks continued for many weeks.

It is believed that the great Lisbon earthquake occurred along the Azores-Gibraltar Fracture Zone (AGFZ). AGFZ marks the boundary of active tectonic interaction between the African and the Eurasian plates. This is an active seismic region where large earthquakes occur with frequency. Some of the larger earthquakes, particularly those occurring closer to the eastern section of AGFZ, are capable of generating tsunamis. The tectonic interaction on the eastern segment of AGFZ involves a thrusting component in NW direction along a NE-trending strike plane. Gravimetry measurements support this conclusion.

The Lisbon earthquake caused considerable damage not only in Portugal but in Spain - particularly in Madrid and Seville. The shock waves were felt throughout Europe and North Africa, over an area of about 1,300,000 square miles.

In Europe, ground motions were felt in Spain, France, Italy, Switzerland, Germany, and as far away as the Duchy of Luxembourg and Sweden. Unusual phenomena were observed at great distances. For example, seiches were observed in Finland. In Italy, an ongoing volcanic eruption of Vesuvius stopped abruptly.

Precursory phenomena also had been widely observed prior to the great earthquake. For example in Spain, there had been reports of falling water levels. Turbid waters and a decrease in water flow in springs and fountains had been reported in both Portugal and Spain.

In North Africa the quake caused heavy loss of life in towns of Algeria and Morocco - more than 400 miles south of Lisbon. The town of Algiers was completely destroyed. Tangiers suffered great loss of lives and extensive damage. The earthquake

was particularly destructive in Morocco, where approximately 10,000 people lost their lives.

It was Sunday, a beautiful day and a great religious holiday in Portugal when the great earthquake struck. It was a little after 9:30 in the morning and most of the people of Lisbon were either already in the churches or on their way to them.

According to an eye-witness, "a strange, frightful noise underground, which resembled the hollow, distant rumbling of thunder," was first heard. He reported that his own house swung from side to side "with a motion like that of a wagon driven violently over wrought stones."

Soon as the quake started, the churches began to rock and sway. The heavy chandeliers began to swing above the heads of the terrified parishioners. Most of the people ran to the streets. The first shock was succeeded by a more violent and longer lasting shock.

The quake's rocking ground motions weakened and cracked Lisbon's buildings which collapsed into the city's narrow streets below, crashing the panicked survivors seeking escape. People ran to the edge of the city and into the fields. Others sought refuge on the banks of the Tagus river, only to perish shortly thereafter by the waves of a huge tsunami.

The destruction caused by the earthquake was beyond description. Lisbon's great cathedrals, Basilica de Santa Maria, Sao Vincente de Fora, Sao Paulo, Santa Catarina, the Misericordia - all full of worshipers - collapsed, killing thousands. Lisbon's whole quay and the marble-built Cais De Pedra along the Tagus disappeared into the river, burying with it hundreds of people who had sought refuge.

Rev. Charles Davy was a survivor of this great Lisbon disaster. The following is an excerpt from his account describing his observations of the tsunami : (Source of historical depiction: Eva March Tappan, ed., The World's Story: A History of the World in Story, Song and Art, 14 Vols., (Boston: Houghton Mifflin, 1914), Vol. V: Italy, France, Spain, and Portugal, pp. 618-628)

"You may judge of the force of this shock, when I inform you it was so violent that I could scarce keep on my knees; but it was attended with some circumstances still more dreadful than the former. On a sudden I heard a general outcry, "The sea is coming in, we shall

be all lost." Upon this, turning my eyes towards the river, which in that place is nearly four miles broad, I could perceive it heaving and swelling in the most unaccountable manner, as no wind was stirring. In an instant there appeared, at some small distance, a large body of water, rising as it were like a mountain. It came on foaming and roaring, and rushed towards the shore with such impetuosity, that we all immediately ran for our lives as fast as possible; many were actually swept away, and the rest above their waist in water at a good distance from the banks.

For my own part I had the narrowest escape, and should certainly have been lost, had I not grasped a large beam that lay on the ground, till the water returned to its channel, which it did almost at the same instant, with equal rapidity. As there now appeared at least as much danger from the sea as the land, and I scarce knew whither to retire for shelter, I took a sudden resolution of returning back, with my clothes all dripping, to the area of St. Paul's. Here I stood some time, and observed the ships tumbling and tossing about as in a violent storm; some had broken their cables, and were carried to the other side of the Tagus; others were whirled around with incredible swiftness; several large boats were turned keel upwards; and all this without any wind, which seemed the more astonishing.

It was at the time of which I am now speaking, that the fine new quay, built entirely of rough marble, at an immense expense, was entirely swallowed up, with all the people on it, who had fled thither for safety, and had reason to think themselves out of danger in such a place: at the same time, a great number of boats and small vessels, anchored near it (all likewise full of people, who had retired thither for the same purpose), were all swallowed up, as in a whirlpool, and never more appeared.

This last dreadful incident I did not see with my own eyes, as it passed three or four stones' throws from the spot where I then was; but I had the account as here given from several masters of ships, who were anchored within two or three hundred yards of the quay, and saw the whole catastrophe. One of them in particular informed me that when the second shock came on, he could perceive the whole city waving backwards and forwards, like the sea when the wind first begins to rise; that the agitation of the earth was so great even under the river, that it threw up his large anchor from the mooring, which swam, as he termed it, on the surface of the water: that immediately upon this extraordinary concussion, the river rose at once near

twenty feet, and in a moment subsided; at which instant he saw the quay, with the whole concourse of people upon it, sink down, and at the same time every one of the boats and vessels that were near it was drawn into the cavity, which he supposed instantly closed upon them, inasmuch as not the least sign of a wreck was ever seen afterwards.

This account you may give full credit to, for as to the loss of the vessels, it is confirmed by everybody; and with regard to the quay, I went myself a few days after to convince myself of the truth, and could not find even the ruins of a place where I had taken so many agreeable walks, as this was the common rendezvous of the factory in the cool of the evening. I found it all deep water, and in some parts scarcely to be fathomed."

The earthquake destroyed Lisbon and other major cities in Portugal. More than 18,000 buildings, representing about 85% of the total were completely demolished. In the first two minutes of the earthquake, about 30,000 people lost their lives. The total death toll in Lisbon, a city of 230,000, was estimated to be about 90,000. Another 10,000 people were killed in Morocco.

About 40 minutes after the earthquake struck the great city, a series of huge tsunami waves crashed over the harbor quays, engulfed the lower part of Lisbon on the shore of the Tagus, and submerged much of the lower part of the city including its newly built, marble quay of Cais De Pedra which disappeared into the river.

The first three of these tsunami waves were the largest and completed the destruction brought about by the two earlier strong quake shocks. 20,000 more of the terrified survivors who had rushed to the open space of the docks and the waterfront quay for safety, lost their lives to these tsunami waves. All boats moored in Lisbon's harbor were destroyed.

About 30 minutes after the earthquake struck Lisbon, the sea level near the Bugie Tower at the mouth of the Tagus River, begun to recede. About 10 minutes later the first large wave arrived, so the tsunami travel time from the source region to Lisbon was approximately 40 minutes. It took less than an hour for this first tsunami to reach Morocco and Algiers, and about 7 hours to reach the Caribbean and the U.S. East coast.

Whatever the earthquake shocks and the tsunami waves spared from destruction, a great fire - which started soon thereafter - finished.

Within minutes the fire spread and turned Lisbon into a raging inferno. Unable to run, hundreds of patients in the Hospital Real burned to death. Remaining survivors ran to the hills and the fields outside the city.

Fanned by steady northeast winds, the great fire burned out of control through the ruins of the city for more than 3 days. It swept everything in its path and destroyed houses, churches and palaces. Lisbon's magnificent museums, and its magnificent libraries - housing priceless documents and papers dealing with the great history of Portugal's great past - burned to the ground. Archives and other precious documents were completely destroyed. Works of art, tapestries, books, manuscripts, including the invaluable records of the India Company were destroyed. Also burned was the king's palace and its 70,000-volume library.

FROM KATIE'S COOKBOOK

Unsausages

4 ½ cups warm water
½ cup soy sauce (I use Braggs Liquid Aminos)
3 ½ cups rolled oats
¼ cup yeast flakes
1 tsp garlic powder
½ tsp Italian seasoning
4 tsp honey
2 tsp sage (I used a little more because I like sage)
1 cup quick oats
¼ cup oil (I used olive oil)
1 Tbsp onion powder

Combine the water and seasonings and bring to a boil, then lower to medium heat. Add the oats and cook eight minutes or until the water is absorbed. Set aside and let cool for about ten minutes. Form patties in your desired size and shape and place on oiled cookie sheet. Bake 15 minutes at 350°, flip over and bake the other side for 15 minutes.

These are easy to make and so good served with gravy, biscuits and scrambled tofu. I made patties, links, and smaller patties to see which I liked the best. I really liked the links.

Scrambled Tofu

1 lb tofu
½ tsp onion powder
1 Tbsp Chicken style seasoning
¼ tsp garlic powder
¼ tsp turmeric
1 tsp yeast flakes
A couple squirts Bragg's aminos

Crumble the tofu and put into a skillet. Add all the seasonings and mix well. Heat until flavors blend well (10-15 minutes) on medium heat.

BY THEIR FRUITS, YE SHALL KNOW THEM

“There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death.” Proverbs 16:25

It is sad to know that the majority of the world has been deceived into thinking their religion will save them.

Every good thing God has provided for His children, Satan has tried to destroy or counterfeit. Just as pranksters will at times turn a road sign around to send people in a wrong direction; it stands to reason that Satan will do everything in his power to confuse God’s children and send them in a wrong direction; thus we have not **one** wrong road but **many**.

Every person who has a desire to spend eternity with God needs to examine his or her faith to see if they are on the right path; but how do we know what the right path is?

“**Thy way, O God, is in the sanctuary:** who is so great a God as our God?” Psalms 77:13

God commanded Moses to build for Him a dwelling place among the Israelites so He could be close to them to guide, instruct and lead them. It was built in such a way that it could be disassembled and reassembled as the people went on their journey to the Promised Land.

“And let them make me a sanctuary; that I may dwell among them.” Exodus 25:8

How was it to be fashioned? “And look that thou make them after their pattern, which was showed thee in the mount.” Exodus 25:40

“Who serve unto the example and **shadow of heavenly things**, as Moses was admonished of God when he was about to make the tabernacle: for, See, saith he, that thou **make all things according to the pattern** showed to thee in the mount.” Hebrews 8:5

God told Moses to make the tabernacle (sanctuary) after heavenly things. God has a dwelling place in heaven, a **heavenly sanctuary** which the **earthly sanctuary** was to be patterned after.

The services that were conducted by the priests in the earthly sanctuary were to represent the services being conducted in the heavenly sanctuary. These services show the way of salvation.

There were three compartments that made up the sanctuary; The **Courtyard**, the **Holy Place** and the **Most Holy Place**.

The altar in the **Courtyard** was where the lambs and other animals (which represented Jesus) were sacrificed. There was also a laver where the priests washed before entering the Holy and Most Holy Places. (Filthi-

ness represents sin.) (Note: The earth is this Courtyard where Jesus was slain.)

On the right, as you enter the **Holy Place** was the table of showbread with twelve cakes which resented the twelve tribes of Israel. It also represented Jesus the ‘Bread of Life’ (The Word of God.)

On the left of the room was the golden lamp stand which represented **Jesus** the ‘light of the world’, **His church** and also **our witness**.

The altar of incense was in the center of the room just in front of the curtain separating the Holy Place from the Most Holy Place. This represented Jesus’ intercessory prayers for us. It could also represent our prayers for each other.

There was only one piece of furniture in the **Most Holy Place**; The ‘Ark of The Testament’. On the lid, (the ‘Mercy Seat’) were two angels facing each other with their heads bowed. Between these angels was where **God’s seat** was.

Every day sacrifices were made in the court yard. Some of the blood was carried and sprinkled on the curtain separating the holy from the most holy. The blood represented Jesus blood, shed to cover our sins. (Think of how filthy it could get in a year.) Once a year it was necessary for the sanctuary to be cleansed, this day was called the Day of Atonement. (Judgment Day)

Ten days before Judgment Day, the people were notified, by the blowing of trumpets, to confess their sins and bring their lambs to be sacrificed. Anyone who refused to make necessary preparation was put out of the camp. No one could survive outside the camp. This represents the lost, who refuse to follow Jesus.

Once a year the high priest would enter the **Most Holy Place**, interceding for the people by sprinkling the blood on the ‘mercy seat’.

Jesus is **today** standing before God in heaven making intercession for His children, pleading, His blood for us. On Judgment day two goats were chosen; one to represent Jesus and one to represent Satan. Lots were cast to see which one would represent Jesus. The Goat, which represented Jesus, was sacrificed and the goat which represented Satan, had all of the sins of the people placed on him and was led into the wilderness to die. Those who die in their sins, will suffer for their own sins;

however, Satan will suffer for the sins of those who are saved.

The ten days the people had been given to make an end of their sins was a **time of probation**. Jesus is today making intercession for us and we are now in a **time of probation**. We are now being judged as the Israelites were.

The people in Noah's day had a time of probation before the door of the ark was closed. In Moses' day the people had time to prepare before the Day of Judgment; Now we have a time of probation before Jesus comes.

The plan of salvation was clearly outlined in the earthly sanctuary services and represents Jesus' work as our High Priest in heaven, interceding for us. He is also the lamb that was slain, making Him not only our sacrifice but also our advocate, our attorney in the heavenly court.

"Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast [our] profession. For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need." Hebrews 4:14-16
There are over three thousand different church denominations in the world; all preaching and teaching they are the true church. Does this confuse you? **It is meant to!**

"There is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling; One Lord, one faith, one baptism, One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all." Ephesians 4:4-6
